III. A few general reminders:

-Band camp must be paid in full.

-ALL completed forms MUST be received before a student is allowed to go to camp.

-Students are responsible for their own prescription/over-the-counter medications while at camp. The band staff and chaperones CANNOT dispense any medication.

-Please let Mr. Leyrer know ahead of time and IN WRITING of any and all pertinent information regarding your child's health (especially diabetes, seizures, and asthma). If your child has an injury or illness of any kind while at camp, you will be contacted. If an injury/illness can be dealt with on campus at the Ghering University Health Center, a chaperone will take care of this. **If your child requires non-emergency treatment (as determined by Edinboro medical staff) that cannot be handled on campus (such as x-rays or medical tests), you will be asked to come to camp and take your child home or to the doctor/hospital. If you refuse, your child will be transported via ambulance to the nearest hospital at your expense.**
